



Climate Activities Report by Chat Education Forum Uganda

Date: November 2024

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Since September 25th, the Chat Education Forum has actively engaged in climate-focused activities in various schools across Mayuge District. These initiatives have centered on establishing nursery beds, tree planting, and educating communities on climate change. Below is a detailed report on the activities conducted at each school and the impact achieved so far?

1. Buseera Primary School - September 25th, 2024

- **Participants:** 110 (Climate Club members, parents, and community members)
- **Activities:**
 - Conducted an introductory seminar on the effects of climate change and the community's role in mitigating these issues.
 - Distributed 200 trees, including mangoes, paw paws, and jackfruit.
 - Planted trees around the school, with some distributed to community members.
- **Impact:** The session encouraged community involvement and created awareness about the importance of trees in climate restoration. Both the school and local households benefited from receiving fruit trees.

2. Busenda Primary School - September 28th, 2024

- **Participants:** Teachers, School Management Committee members, parents, and community leaders.
- **Activities:**
 - Organized a seminar on climate change effects and the role of local communities in global climate action.
 - Established a nursery bed for seedlings.
 - Distributed 300 trees, including 100 planted on school grounds and 200 given to community members and parents.



- **Impact:** This event strengthened community ties and provided practical solutions for climate action through tree planting and seedling propagation. The seminar increased awareness among school leaders and local stakeholders.

3. Buswikira Primary School - November 5th, 2024

- **Participants:** Climate Club members, parents, and community members.
- **Activities:**
 - Conducted a tree-planting exercise around the school.
 - Provided seeds for nursery bed establishment.
 - Distributed 200 trees, comprising pawpaw, mango, musizi, and musabya varieties; 100 trees were planted within the school, and the remaining 100 were given to community members.
- **Impact:** The event furthered tree cover within the school and the surrounding area, adding valuable indigenous and fruit-bearing trees. It also continued the community's education on sustainable practices for environmental protection.





4. Wandegeya Primary School - November 26th, 2024

Participants: Climate Club members, teachers, parents, and community members.

Activities:

- Conducted a seminar on climate change and the role of trees in environmental conservation.
- Planted trees around the school compound.
- Distributed seedlings to community members to encourage tree planting at home.

Impact: The session provided students and community members with valuable knowledge on climate action while increasing the school's greenery. The event also strengthened community participation in environmental sustainability efforts.

Participants: Students, teachers, and local community members.

Activities:

- Conducted a seminar on climate change awareness and practical mitigation strategies.
- Planted trees within the school compound.
- Provided trees for community members to plant in their homes.

Impact: The event enhanced environmental education for students while expanding tree



cover within the school and surrounding areas. Community members also received practical insights into how they can contribute to climate restoration efforts.
